


# meet the author

Popati Hiranandani

A poet by instinct, Popati Ramchand Hiranandani, who considers herself a daughter of the soil, excels in every literary genre she has touched upon. Born at Hyderabad Sind (now in Pakistan) in 1924, she was the second eldest among seven children. She lost her father at the age of ten and started working at fourteen. At the age of twenty-one she refused to get married to a man who demanded dowry from her mother. Firmly and quietly independent, she has carved out a distinct niche for herself both in Sindhi literature and in Sindhi community.

She started her career as a music teacher. After graduating from the Benaras Hindu University with distinction in Sanskrit, she moved to teaching languages and literature. She retired as Head of Sindhi Department, Kishinchand Chell-

aram College, Bombay. During the last years of her teaching at this college, the University of Bombay associated her with postgraduate teaching and research programme — a rare hounour, indeed.

A prolific writer, Popati Hiranandani is pro-life. She is, infact a very popular writer in Sindhi, and has successfully protrayed in her writings different aspects of life of the struggling Indian woman. She has written about fifty books which include such genres as story, novel, play, poetry, essay, criticism, philology, and history of literature and her Sahitya Akademi Award winner Munhinji-a-Hyati-a-ja-sona-Ropa-Varga (The golden and silver pages of my life) is a revealing autobiography of a crusading Indian woman and writer. This profoundly engaging autobiography of hers gives a remarkable insight into Sindhi society, the social and political upheavel following the partition of India and the great tragedy overtaking the country.

Popati Hiranandani has fought many battles with her pen and with the power of her arguments by raising her voice against social evils and injustices at political level, and has taken a bold stand against traditional hypocrisies. She has been an untiring writer throughout her literary career of over five decades. She has also written four books in English SINDHIS: THE SCATTERED TREASURE, THE COWARD (Short Stories), HISTORY OF POST-IND-EPENDENCE SINDHI LITERATURE and I BELONG TO A LAND, a recent volume of poems. Her books in sindhi have been translated into various Indian languages. She has also written radio plays and dance dramas and has participated in many discussions on television.

Popati Hiranandani has travelled extensively in Europe, Far East Asia and other foreign countries and delivered lectures on Indian philosophy and the Vedas during her tours abroad. Apart from the Sahitya Akademi Award (1982), she has won many awards and honours for her contribution to literature. She was honoured at the 50th Marathi Sahitya Sammelan at Ichalkaranji in 1974 and at All India Women Writers' Conference at Nainital in 1975. She received the 'Woman of the Year' Award in 1988 and the Maharashtra Gauray Award in 1990.

In her writing one message stands, out clearly: TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUE, she says quoting Polinius's advice in HAMLET. Finally, a poet of great sensitivity, she writes:

I am a wave a wave of water When I see the moon I send my heart to him I place him on my bosom And fondie him, rock him And make him dance with me.
