





Ila was born in Mumbai on 16th June, 1938. That was the year when her father Gunvantrai Acharya, well-known writer, wrote the novel Purta Janma. Putra Janma can be described as a first feminist novel in Gujarati. Ila inherited her father's legacy of writing, and feminism-equility of

men and women.

Her schooling was done in Jamangar, Rajkot and then in Mumbai. Those were the days when there was no elitism, snobbishness or class consciousness in schools. Ila got firsthand knowledge of social norms, rules and regulations and women's status by mingling with various types of girls in school.

Completing her S.S.C. she joined Ramnarain Ruia College and did B.A. with Gujarati and Sanskritin 1st Division and won Tulja Gauri Krishnlal Zaveri scholarship. She did her M.A. with same subjects and joined Ruia College as a lecturer, from 1960 to 1967.

She got married to Dr Arab Mehta in 1964. Later on she chose to be at home and devote her time to her children Salil and Sonali. However, life took an unexpected turn when she lost her father in 1965. His death was sudden and swift and he could not finish his book Ramat Ramade Ram.

From her student days IIa had begun writing for Akhand Anand, Navneet, Stree Jivan. So it was but natural that the family asked her to complete her father's novel.

She wrote last chapters in a fortnight and thus commenced her new career as a writer.

Ila also enjoyed teaching and joined St. Xavier's College in 1971 and worked till 2000.

For Ila, writing was a part of her "being". Though she continued to be a mother or a teacher, her mind's workshop was never idle. Her creative mind was full of new stories, characters and new

story lines which demanded on utterances, expression. However, writing is not just inspiration. It requires commitment, discipline and dedication. Ila would get up at four in the morning to Many a time she write. would write with the right hand and correct spelling mistakes of children's homework by the left. It was "Tap". indeed a "Yajna", Since 1966 Ila has written 18 novels. five collections of

short stories, a compilation of essays and creative writings on "Death", besides numerous radio and tele plays.

Ila's writing is a journey on the road less traveled. Her novels, short stories always tell "new stories", and have new types of characters and new settings, all weaved in imaginative and artistic presentation. There should be special mention of her novels, Batris Putlini Vedanao, Paanch Pagla Prithvi Par. Batris Putlini Vedanao is acknowledged as a remarkable feminist novel in Gujarati literature. Paanch Pagla Prithvi Par examines social, economical and political reasons for women's subjugation.

Ila is also an accomplished short story writer.

Many of her short stories are included in Anthologies of Best Short Stories. Like her novels, her short stories are written on vast canvas of five continents - Yankipur, Vienna Woods, Yatna have Isreal, Africa, Europe as background.

Ila is an excellent speaker. In her student days, she had won many prizes for elocution. Even now listening to her short stories read out by her is a vivid experience.

Household duties, a regular job, writing and reading do not leave much time for other activities. Ila is not associated with various institutions. She does not attend many literary meets. That suits her fine, "...Nothing to distract me from my reading & writing", she smiles.
