## Bhasha Samman:



# **SAHITYA AKADEMI EXHIBITION**

Sahitya Akademi Exhibition will be inaugurated by Prof Satyavrat Shastri, distinguished Sanskrit scholar and Fellow, Sahitya Akademi, at 10.00 a.m. on February 21, 2017. Sahitya Akademi Exhibition is an annual kick starter event that marks the beginning of the Festival of Letters in Rabindra Bhavan Complex in New Delhi

Sahitya Akademi Exhibition highlights the achievements of the past year but more importantly also showcases, through a series of photographs, the story of Sahitya Akademi over past six decades, seminal moments in its history,

the achievements, crises and the iconic people who adorned the Akademi. The Exhibition is designed in such a way that a viewer can have precise and comprehensive understanding of Akademi's objectives, work, activities and other related information at one go.

Prof Satyavrat Shastri is a most distinguished Sanskrit scholar, writer, grammarian and poet. He has three Mahakavyas, three Khandakavyas, one Prabandhakavya, one Patrakavya and five works of critical writing in Sanskrit. His important works are *Ramakirtimahakavyam*, *Brahattaram Bharatam*, *Sribodhisattvacharitam*, *Vaidika Vyakarana*, *Sarmanyadesah Sutram Vibhati*, and *Discovery of Sanskrit Treasures* (in seven volumes). In his long and illustrious career, Prof Satyavrat Shastri has been feted and decorated with many honors and a large number of awards, chief among which are: Sahitya Akademi Award, Jnanpith Award, Padma Bhushan, Kalidasa Award, Pandit Jagannatha Sanskrit Padya-racana Puraskara and Shastra-chudamani Award.

# Gramatok

Gramalok is Sahitya Akademi's village outreach programme as part of its vision to take the best of Indian literature to every nook and corner of the country. Although Sahitya Akademi has been organizing literary events in rural areas throughout the country for years, Gramalok was officially launched on Gandhi Jayanti (October 2, 2016) in Chapalgaon, Solapur and will be completely dedicated to promote literature in the villages of India. Gramalok will also act as a platform for talented writers / poets / scholars living in villages without sufficient exposure to showcase their talents. The Akademi plans to organize a large number village outreach programmes in 2017 as part of its commitment to inculcate good reading habits and promote literary taste among masses.



# Sahitya Akademi Awards 2016 - Winners

## **Assamese**

Jnan Pujari is an eminent Assamese poet, translator and playwright. He was born on 1st March 1948 in Kamdewal, Assam. Meghamalar Bhraman is a poetry collection which is thought-provoking, full of substance and portrays, among other things, harsh realities of our daily lives in a realistic yet restrained manner.





#### Hindi

Nasera Sharma is an eminent Hindi fiction writer, editor, translator and script writer. Parijata is a novel dealing with the relevance and complexity of human relationships in the backdrop of Ganga-Jamuni composite culture of Allahabad.

## Bengali

**Nṛsimha Prasād Bhāduri** is an eminent Bengali and Sanskrit scholar. *Mahabharater Astadashi* is a collection of essays analyzing with remarkable clarity the role and portrayal of women protagonists in the Mahabharata in the light of modern understanding.





### Kannada

**Bolwar Mahamad Kunhi** is an eminent Kannada short story writer and novelist. *Swatantryada Ota* is a novel dealing with the rural life in modern India – from the time of partition to the contemporary India. The novel portrays the life of Hindus and Muslims in a village set to Ramayana backdrop.

## **Bodo**

Anjalee Basumatary is a well-known Bodo poet and writer. Ang Mabwrwi Dong Daswng is a collection of poems dealing with the plight of and injustice to women in the world.



## Kashmiri

Aziz Hajini is an eminent Kashmiri writer and critic. Aan-e-Khane is a collection of critical essays covering a wide range of literary traditions of Kashmir from Lal Vakh to Sheikh-e-Shruki to Ghazal to Kashmiri drama to Sufi Shairi to other religious prose to contemporary Kashmiri writings.



Chhatrapal (Joginder Pal Saraf) is an eminent Dogri fiction writer, translator and script writer. Cheta is a collection of short stories dealing with varied societal issues and portrayal of several shades of daily lives of common persons.



## Konkani

Edwin J.F. D'Souza is an eminent Konkani fiction writer and critic. Kallem Bhangaar is a novel dealing with a middle-class family amid the Gulf oil rush and based on the life in Mangaluru and Kuwait during the Iraqi invasion.



Jerry Pinto is an eminent English writer, journalist, translator, editor and script writer. Em and the Big Hoom is a novel about the family of four where the mother suffers from an extremely volatile mental condition. The paradox is that it is a dysfunctional family and yet it is lit with an inner light of compassion, intense concern, humanness and warmth.



# Maithili Shyam Da

**Shyam Darihare** is an eminent Maithili fiction writer and poet. *Barki Kaki at Hotmail Dot Com* is a collection of short stories with varied themes dealing with the lives of ordinary people from different walks of life.



**Kamal Vora** is an eminent Gujarati poet and writer. *Anekek* is a collection of poetry of varied themes. The poems in the collection are extremely suggestive and the author sensitively weaves images with enough spaces between those images.





## Malayalam

**Prabha Varma** is an eminent Malayalam poet, litterateur, journalist, lyricist and editor. Shyama Madhavam is a novel in verse, a fifteen chapter Kaavyakhyayika. It revolves around Lord Krishna and the lives of those who come across him during his earthly sojourn.



## Manipuri

Moirangthem Rajen is a well-known Manipuri short story writer and poet. Cheptharaba Ishingpun is a collection of short stories dealing with the reality of contemporary Manipuri society. Most of the stories deal with the inner world and struggles of Manipuri women in a patriarchal set up which is filled with corruption and degradation.





## Sanskrit

**Sitanath Acharya** is an eminent Sanskrit scholar and writer. *Kavyanirjhari* is a collection of forty-five poems dealing with a wide range of themes and is marked by versatility and fervour.

## Marathi

Aasaram Marotrao Lomte is a well-known Marathi writer. Aalok is a collection of short stories depicting various issues of rural life in Maharashtra. This work is a powerful and objective representation of the cross-section of the all-pervasive change that has been taking place in rural Maharashtra.



# Santali Gobind (

*Gobind Chandra Majhi* is a noted Santali poet and fiction writer. *Nalha* is a collection of poems dealing with a wide range of issues prevalent in the contemporary Santal society.

## Nepali

Gita Upadhyay is an eminent bilingual writer and translator. Janmabhumi Mero Swadesh is a historical novel portraying the glorious contribution of the Gurkhas during the freedom struggle on the one hand and to amplify the efforts of the protagonist to emancipate his countrymen from the deep dogmatic slumber with a vision of post-independence society.



## Sindhi Nandlal

Nandlal Javeri is a noted Sindhi poet and fiction writer. Akhar Katha is a collection of poems dealing with the varied themes and deal with several issues covering almost entire human existence and portray the significance and insignificance of human life in one go.

## Odia

**Paramita Satpathy** is an eminent Odia fiction writer and translator. *Prapti* is a collection of short stories dealing with the eventualities of human fate, especially that of women.



## **Tamil**

Vannadasan (S. Kalyanasundaram) is an eminent Tamil poet, fiction writer and critic. Oru Siru Isai is a collection of fifteen short stories that reflect the in-depth emotions of humanity and interpersonal relationships in a soothing way.



Swarajbir is an eminent Punjabi poet and playwright. Massia Di Raat is a play dealing with the immense social pressure on a woman to give birth to a male child. Weaving around this central theme are the other aspects of this inequality meted out to women and how women without a male child are often pushed down to a lower social and economic status in the society.



## Telugu

**Papineni Siva Sankar** is an eminent Telugu poet, fiction writer and critic. *Rajanigandha* is a collection of poems dealing with a wide range of emotions and real life situations.

## Rajasthani

**Bulaki Sharma** is an eminent Rajasthani fiction writer. *Murdjat Ar Dujee Kahaniyan* is a collection of short stories dealing with the pain and struggles of common people in Rajasthan.
